Next Sunday is Gospel Sunday!

This year's date, **Sunday, June 16**, was chosen to coincide with the week of *Juneteenth* (the commemoration of June 19th of the end of slavery on this day in 1865, when the news finally was announced in Texas - two and a half years *after* the Emancipation Proclamation). Highly acclaimed gospel choir director Linda Brown-San Martin will again be our guest director. Beloved for her work with many area singers, Ms. Brown San-Martin is the winner of the New England Conservatory's 2009 Gospel Music Award for "longevity in music ministry," and has directed choirs at numerous local churches and colleges after becoming the first Gospel Choir Director at her alma mater, Wellesley College. She has led multiple Gospel Sunday services at First Parish and notes that "in challenging times such as these, the joy, love, resiliency and unity generated by singing gospel music can truly be a healing balm for the soul."

Do you want to meet more people at First Parish?

A great way to meet people and get involved at First Parish is to **join The Welcome Team Ministry**. Members commit once a month to usher or greet for the hour before church and assist with the collection and other small tasks during the UU Theology Panel in the Barn Room service. Serving on the team allows you to help create a welcoming atmosphere for newcomers. It is a wonderful way to connect with members as well as newcomers. Accompaniment Volunteering

First Parish is a member of the CISC, a coalition of Cambridge-area congregations that is currently hosting a woman and her two children in sanctuary so she can avoid deportation and separation from her family. "Accompaniment" volunteers are needed seven days a week on-site at a church in Harvard Square. We can pair you with an experienced volunteer so you won't be on your own.

Child Care Volunteering

The CISC childcare team is looking for several new volunteers who can commit to regular monthly outings to ensure that the children (ages 2 and 4) are able to spend time outside each day. A simple hour or two of outdoor play means so much in the life of this family we've committed as a coalition to support. Because coverage and consistency are ongoing concerns, we are looking for people who can commit to at least 2 weekday morning or afternoon outings a month.
